

Longborough Festival Opera appoints Emily Gottlieb as Executive Director

Longborough Festival Opera has appointed Emily Gottlieb as its new Executive Director from April 2024. Gottlieb joins Longborough from the National Opera Studio where she served as Chief Executive for nine years, following 15 years with the Royal Opera House.

Under her leadership, Longborough will take on the biggest challenge in all opera, staging Wagner's *Der Ring des Nibelungen* in summer 2024 with a new confidence and energy.

Emily Gottlieb said: "I'm thrilled to join the Longborough team, especially in this exciting and ambitious year where this intrepid company is mounting Wagner's monumental Ring Cycle.

Longborough has already achieved a reputation for pushing boundaries, and its inventiveness and aspiration are together a draw and a testament to the whole team who make up the company. I look forward to working with Polly, Anthony, staff, artists and trustees to realise the 2024 festival and Longborough's excellent education programmes, and to help shape its exciting future plans".

Gottlieb's appointment comes as Longborough prepares to stage all four productions in Wagner's epic *Der Ring des Nibelungen* in summer 2024, alongside a new production of Puccini's *La bohème*, and a series of talks and masterclasses to accompany the Ring. At the same time, Longborough will present its latest Playground Opera, a family friendly production of *The Elixir of Love*, in schools in the Cotswolds.

Emily has been the Chief Executive of the National Opera Studio for nine years. Prior to this, she spent 15 years with the Royal Opera House; first as Stage Manager, managing over 60 productions for The Royal Opera, and then taking a leading role under CEO Alex Beard in the organisational development of the ROH. She was the first ever Consortium-supported Performing Arts Fellow on the Clore Leadership Programme in 2012-13. She has worked in leading opera companies around the world, including Glyndebourne Festival Opera, Grange Park Opera and Opera Australia. Emily is a Founder Director of Opera UK, a Trustee of the Buxton International Festival, a Fellow of the Royal Society for Arts and a relational dynamics coach.
